

Kindergarten - Winter Interpretive Hike

Classroom Teacher Information

Programs are subject to change based on weather, temperature, road conditions, public health and safety concerns.

Synopsis:

In this hands-on exploration, students will explore the Logan River and National Forest at Stokes Nature Center to discover what lives there, the needs of these living things, and how they depend on each other and their surroundings to get what they need to live.

Students will record the biodiversity they observe.

Students will:

- Participate in group & individual exploration of nature
- Share what they find verbally
- Become aware that living things need water, air, and resources and that they live in places that have the things they need

Length of Program: 1.5 hours Season(s) Offered: Winter Program fee: \$6 per student

Location: Varies depending on snow conditions (King's Nature Park-Bonneville Shoreline Trail or Logan

River Trail at Stokes Nature Center).

Logistics: Please plan time to load the bus at your school and drive to the field site.

- Confirm the location of your field experience with the driver before leaving your school.
- Please arrive at the site 5 minutes before your program starts. Programs will begin and end on time.
- Students should wear comfortable clothing that may get dirty and/or wet.
- We will be outside for the entirety of this program, dressing in layers is advised.
- Students should wear snow boots. Please, no sneakers!
- We have a limited number of boots, coats, and gloves to loan your students if they need them. Please request these <u>at least two days in advance</u> of your program.
- Students should wear visible name tags at all times (packing tape over a name tag keeps them from falling off).
- Please bring one adult per five students (there is no charge for teachers or chaperones).
- Running water will not be available at the site, so please plan ahead with water bottles.
- Restrooms may not be available, depending on the field site, so plan ahead accordingly.
